The Bank of Kaukauna, Kaukauna, Wisconsin ("Bank"), having been advised of its right to a NOTICE OF CHARGES AND OF HEARING detailing the unsafe or unsound banking practices alleged to have been committed by the Bank, and of its right to a hearing on the charges under section 8(b) of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act ("Act"), 12 U.S.C. § 1818(b), and under section 220.04(9) of the Wisconsin Statutes, Wis. Stat. § 220.04(9), regarding hearings before the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions ("WDFI"), and having waived those rights, by and through its duly elected and acting board of directors entered into a STIPULATION AND CONSENT TO THE ISSUANCE OF AN AMENDED CONSENT ORDER ("STIPULATION") with representatives of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation

("FDIC") and the WDFI, dated June 13, 2012, whereby, solely for the purpose of this proceeding and without admitting or denying the charges of unsafe or unsound banking practices relating to capital, asset quality, management and earnings, the Bank consented to the issuance of an AMENDED CONSENT ORDER ("ORDER") by the FDIC and the WDFI.

The FDIC and the WDFI considered the matter and determined to accept the STIPULATION.

Having also determined that the requirements for issuance of an order under 12 U.S.C. § 1818(b) and Section 220.04(9) of the Wisconsin Statutes, Wis. Stat. § 220.04(9), have been satisfied, the FDIC and the WDFI HEREBY ORDER, that the Bank, its institution-affiliated parties, as that term is defined in section 3(u) of the Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1813(u), and its successors and assigns take affirmative action as follows:

MANAGEMENT

1. (a) From the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall have and retain qualified management. Management shall be provided the necessary written authority to implement the provisions of this ORDER. Each member of management shall have the qualifications and experience commensurate with his or her duties and responsibilities at the Bank. The qualifications of management shall be assessed on its ability to:

- (i) comply with the requirements of this ORDER;
- (ii) operate the Bank in a safe and sound manner;
- (iii) comply with applicable laws, rules, and regulations; and
- (iv) restore all aspects of the Bank to a safe and sound condition.

(b) During the life of this ORDER, prior to the addition of any individual to the board of directors or the employment of any individual as a senior executive officer, the Bank shall request and obtain the written approval of the Administrator, Division of Banking of the WDFI ("Administrator"). For purposes of this ORDER, "senior executive officer" is defined as in section 32 of the Act, 12 U.S.C. § 1831i, and section 303.101(b) of the FDIC Rules and Regulations, 12 C.F.R. § 303.101(b).

MANAGEMENT STUDY

2. (a) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall revise its plan to implement the recommendations of the Management Study conducted by Wipfli LLP as of January 2011. The revisions to the Bank's plan shall include changes to succession planning as detailed in the January 30, 2012 FDIC Report of Examination.

(b) A copy of the plan required by this paragraph shall be submitted to the Regional Director of the Chicago Regional Office ("Regional Director") and the Administrator.

PARTICIPATION BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

3. (a) As of the effective date of this ORDER, the board of directors shall maintain its increased participation in the affairs of the Bank, assuming full responsibility for the approval of sound policies and objectives and for the supervision of all of the Bank's activities, consistent with the role and expertise commonly expected for directors of Banks of comparable size. This participation shall include meetings to be held no less frequently than monthly at which, at a minimum, the following areas shall be reviewed and approved: reports of income and expenses; new, overdue, renewal, charged off, and recovered loans; adoption or modification of operating policies; audit reports; internal control reviews including managements responses; and compliance with this ORDER. Board of directors' minutes shall document these reviews and approvals, including the names of any dissenting directors.

(b) During the life of this ORDER, the Bank's board of directors shall have in place a program that will provide for monitoring of the Bank's compliance with this ORDER.

CAPITAL

4. (a) From the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall have and maintain its level of Tier 1 capital as a percentage of its total assets ("capital ratio") at a minimum of nine percent (9.0%) and its level of qualifying total capital as a percentage of risk-weighted assets ("total risk based capital ratio") at a minimum of twelve percent (12.0%). For purposes of this ORDER, Tier 1 capital, qualifying total capital, total assets, and risk-weighted assets shall be calculated in accordance with Part 325 of the FDIC Rules and Regulations ("Part 325"), 12 C.F.R. Part 325.

(b) Within sixty (60) days from the effective date of this Order, the Bank shall revise, implement, and adhere to its written capital plan detailing how the Bank intends to comply with the requirements of paragraph 4(a). Said plan shall include, at a minimum:

- (i) timelines for implementation;
- (ii) requirements that all transactions shall be consummated in full compliance with all laws, rules, and regulations; and
- (iii) contingency provisions for the sale or merger of the bank.

The plan required by this paragraph shall be acceptable to the Regional Director and the Division.

ALLOWANCE FOR LOAN AND LEASE LOSSES

5. (a) Prior to submission or publication of all Reports of Condition and Income required by the FDIC after the effective date of this ORDER, the board of directors of the Bank shall review the adequacy of the Bank's ALLL, provide for an adequate ALLL, and accurately report the same. The minutes of the board of directors' meeting at which such review is undertaken shall indicate the findings of the review, the amount of increase in the ALLL recommended, if any, and the basis for determination of the amount of ALLL provided. In making these determinations, the board of directors shall consider the FFIEC Instructions for the Reports of Condition and Income and any analysis of the Bank's ALLL provided by the FDIC or the WDFI.

(b) ALLL entries required by this paragraph shall be made prior to any capital determinations required by this ORDER.

(c) Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall take all necessary steps to comply with the Interagency Policy Statement on the ALLL, including, at a minimum, the deficiencies identified within the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination.

PROHIBITION OF ADDITIONAL LOANS TO CLASSIFIED BORROWERS

6. (a) As of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall not extend, directly or indirectly, any additional credit to, or for the benefit of, any borrower who is already obligated in any manner to the Bank on any extension of credit (including any portion thereof) that has been charged off the books of the Bank or classified "Loss" in the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination, so long as such credit remains uncollected.

(b) As of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall not extend, directly or indirectly, any additional credit to, or for the benefit of, any borrower whose loan or other credit has been classified "Substandard" in the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination, and is uncollected unless the Bank's board of directors has adopted, prior to such extension of credit, a detailed written statement giving the reasons why such extension of credit is in the best interest of the Bank. A copy of the statement shall be signed by each Director, and incorporated in the minutes of the applicable board of directors' meeting. A copy of the statement shall be placed in the appropriate loan file and shall be incorporated in the minutes of the applicable board of directors' meeting. For purposes of this ORDER, payment by the Bank of reasonable costs, expenses or fees necessary or appropriate for the

evaluation, preservation, repossession, or disposition of collateral shall not constitute an indirect extension of credit.

REDUCTION OF DELINQUENCIES AND CLASSIFIED ASSETS

7. (a) Within sixty (60) days from the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall revise, implement, and adhere to its written plan to reduce the Bank's risk position in each asset in excess of \$250,000 which is more than ninety (90) days delinquent, or classified "Substandard" in the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination.

(b) As used in this paragraph, "reduce" means to: (1) collect; (2) charge off; or (4) improve the quality of such assets so as to warrant removal of any adverse classification by the FDIC and the WDFI.

(c) A copy of the plan required by this paragraph shall be submitted to the Regional Director and the Administrator.

(d) While this ORDER remains in effect, the plan shall be revised to include assets which become more than ninety (90) days delinquent after the effective date of this ORDER or are adversely classified at any subsequent examinations.

CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT

8. (a) During the life of this ORDER, the Bank shall revise, implement, and adhere to its written plan to manage each of the concentrations of credit identified in the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination in a safe and sound manner. At a minimum, the plan must provide for written procedures for the ongoing measurement and monitoring of the concentrations of credit, and a limit on concentrations commensurate with the Bank's capital position, safe and sound banking practices, and the overall risk profile of the Bank.

(b) The plan to manage each concentration of credit shall be updated and revised as necessary each calendar quarter this ORDER is in effect.

PROFIT PLAN AND BUDGET

9. (a) Within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall revise, implement, and adhere to its written profit plan and a realistic, comprehensive budget for all categories of income and expense for calendar years 2012 and 2013. The plans required by this paragraph shall contain formal goals and strategies, consistent with sound banking practices, to reduce discretionary expenses and to improve the Bank's overall earnings, and shall contain a description of the operating assumptions that form the basis for major projected income and expense components.

(b) Within thirty (30) days from the end of each calendar quarter following completion of the profit plans and budgets required by this paragraph, the Bank's board of directors shall evaluate the Bank's actual performance in relation to the plan and budget, record the results of the evaluation, and note any actions taken by the Bank in the minutes of the board of directors' meeting at which such evaluation is undertaken.

(c) A written profit plan and budget shall be prepared for each calendar year for which this ORDER is in effect.

(d) Copies of the plans and budgets required by this paragraph shall be submitted to the Regional Director and the Administrator.

LIQUIDITY PLAN

10. (a) Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall revise, implement, and adhere to its written contingency funding plan ("Liquidity Plan"). The Liquidity Plan shall identify sources of liquid assets to meet the Bank's contingency funding needs over time horizons of one month, two months, and three months. At a minimum, the Liquidity Plan shall be prepared in conformance with the Liquidity Risk Management Guidance found at FIL-84-2008 and

include provisions to address the issues identified in the January 30, 2012 Report of Examination.

(b) A copy of the plan required by this paragraph shall be submitted to the Regional Director and the Administrator.

DIVIDEND RESTRICTION

11. As of the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall not pay or declare any dividend without the prior written consent of the Regional Director and the Administrator.

WRITTEN PROGRESS REPORTS

12. Within thirty (30) days from the end of each calendar quarter following the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall furnish to the Regional Director and the Administrator written progress reports signed by each member of the Bank's board of directors, detailing the actions taken to secure compliance with the ORDER and the results thereof.

NOTIFICATION TO SHAREHOLDER

13. Following the effective date of this ORDER, the Bank shall send to its shareholder a copy of this ORDER: (1) in conjunction with the Bank's next shareholder communication; or (2) in conjunction with its notice or proxy statement preceding the Bank's next shareholder meeting.

CLOSING PARAGRAPHS

This ORDER shall be effective on the date of issuance.

The provisions of this ORDER shall be binding upon the Bank, its institution-affiliated parties, and any successors and assigns thereof.

The provisions of this ORDER shall remain effective and enforceable except to the extent that, and until such time as, any provision has been modified, terminated, suspended, or set aside by the FDIC and the WDFI.
